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## SQA

The SQA exmainations start next week on Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> April and run until Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> June (dates inclusive). We wish every young perosn sitting SQA exmainations this session at Harris Academy the very best of luck.

Our Invigilation Team met in school this week to go over procedures and protocols for supporting our young people over the next five and a half weeks. We are extremely grateful for their commitment to our school in a challenging year.

### **Study Leave**

Dundee City Council's Education Department has agreed that all pupils in S4 and S5 sitting **one or more National 5, Higher or A Higher** SQA examination/s, with a final examination included, will be entitled to examination preparation time (study leave) during this year's SQA Examination Diet, as will **all** S6 pupils.

Pupils in S4 and S5 being presented at National 3, National 4 levels and/or Skills for Work courses and National Progression Awards do not sit a final examination and should **attend school as normal throughout the SQA Examination Diet.** Those young people not entitled to be absent from school during the examination preparation period should follow their present timetable from Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> May. Further information will be made available in due course.

This year's SQA Examination Preparation Period begins on **Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2022 and ends on Friday 27th May 2022 (both dates inclusive)**. Senior pupils should return to school on **Monday 30th May 2022**.

If any pupil has an examination out with the exam preparation period, then s/he is permitted to prepare at home **the day before the examination and will be excused from classes on the day of the examination.** This comes into effect from Monday 25<sup>th</sup> April 2022.

### Pupil absence from SQA exams

Please note that if your young person is prevented from attending an examination for any reason is essential that you contact the school office as early as possible on the morning of the examination to report the reason for the absence. This will allow school staff to ascertain if an examination exceptional circumstances request should be made.





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# Arriving late for SQA exams

If your young person arrives late for their SQA examination, they will not be entitled to any extra time and will finish the examination at the scheduled time. Pupils are allowed into the examination room up to **30 minutes late after the start of any examination longer than one hour in length.** If a young person arrives after this time s/he will **not** be allowed into the examination room in accordance with SQA procedures. Please contact the school office at your earliest convenience if your young person is going to be late for an SQA examination in order that the SQA Co-ordinator and Chief Invigilator can be made aware as early as possible.

#### **Dundee University Summer Taster Sessions**

I'm pleased to confirm that Dundee University will running three days of events in June aimed at providing prospective students an insight into Higher Education and a "taster" of the subjects they might be interested in pursuing. This event would be aimed specifically at our new S6 pupils (currently S5) who would be about to begin work on their UCAS application and would be applying to university for 2023 intake. The subjects available on each day are as follows:

All pupils planning to attend on their chosen day will need to register for a place. Booking a place will be done during their PHSE class or by giving a note of interest to Miss R Walker (Birnam. This can also be done by emailing the school and giving your child's name and a note of their preferred subjects.

The event is restricted to 100 pupils per day, so it is on a first come first served basis.
