Newsletter for young people, parents, and carers

Updated version based on the Deputy First Minister's announcement that schools will re-open to all pupils in August.

Dear Pupil / Parent / Carer,

On Tuesday, the Deputy First Minister Mr Swinney announced that, if the positive progress continues in the fight against COVID-19, all young people will return to school in August.

When I wrote to you on Monday, I had stated that we would run with our Recovery Plan for at least two weeks however due to National and Local information, this will no longer be possible. **Therefore, please treat my initial newsletter, which was issued on Monday as our contingency plan; one that will only be utilised if the Government's advice shifts towards a staggered re-entry.**

The following content is our current 'Plan A' based on the most up-to-date information. Please be assured that in the background, Mrs MacDonald, our school timetabler, has been working on a 'full return' timetable.

Week beginning 10th August

Our revised plan, to allow for safe, staggered return to school which allows all year groups to have an induction to our new safe working practices is detailed below:

Thursday	<p>S1, S4, S5 and S6 pupils continue in their timetabled classes</p> <p>S3 begin their timetabled classes All S3 pupils should report to an allocated room for an extended registration and information session before normal classes resume. The week before school returns, we will send information via our website, emails and Twitter that will inform young people as to which room they should report to.</p>	<p>S1, S3, S4, S5 and S6 pupils continue in their timetabled classes</p> <p>S2 begin their timetabled classes (PM) at 1.10pm All S2 pupils should report to an allocated room for an extended registration and information session before normal classes resume. The week before school returns, we will send information via our website, emails and Twitter that will inform young people as to which room they should report to.</p>
Friday	All year groups return to their timetabled classes.	

Uniform

In light of the fact that all young people will return in August on a full-time basis, **full school uniform** will be our preferred dress code for young people.

Please note that our alternative uniform of a hooded sweatshirt from August to October has now been cancelled. The rationale behind this plan rested on the fact that young people would not be in the building full time and therefore we did not want parents / carers to have to purchase uniform that would not be fully utilised.

We will hold a uniform event on Wednesday 5th August (4-6pm) here at school where ties, blazers and other articles of school uniform will be available to purchase.

All of our new S1 pupils will be given a tie as a gift from the school and can either be picked up at our uniform event on the 5th August or at the school on Monday 10th.

As a reminder to most, our school uniform consists of:

- Black Trousers or Skirt
- Black shoes *or plain black trainers*
- Harris tie (*available to purchase from the school the week before school starts or at the Schoolwear shop at a cost of £6 per tie*)
- White shirt or blouse
- And, preferable but not compulsory, our Harris blazer which can be ordered via Academy Uniforms. Wool and polyester options are both available.

Pupils should bring their own pencil case with all necessary equipment with them from class to class. Pencil case equipment should not be shared with any other pupil.
