Punctuality is important

Huge thanks to all of our young people who arrive on time for learning every day.

Unfortunately we have seen a rise in young people arriving late for school over the past few weeks. From Monday 29th January – Thursday 1st February (dates inclusive) we had 109 young people arrive after 8.50am (5 minutes late) and before 9.30am (45 minutes late) – some on two or three occasions.



The infographic above outlines the negative effect poor punctuality can have on a young person in relation to lost learning.

😑 Pupil Support


The link between high levels of attendance at school and high levels of pupil attainment is clear.

Our collective attendance (S1-S6) is sitting below 90% at 88%. This causes us concern as we attempt to support all of our young people to achieve success in their learning in the BGE and Senior Phase.

The support of parents / carers is crucial in ensuring that young people attend school regularly. The infographic above details the volume of learning missed as attendance levels decrease.


